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




1. Experience of the study session

- This experience gave me a new motivation about my life










- I've met new people the share Don Bosco's mission. They are fantastic and I am very grateful for this.








3. Expectations of the training course








4. Programme and methods








5. I gained confidence and competences










7. Assessment of the learning environment





I'm really grateful for the food and that my allergies were being accounted for. Though I really lacked a proper breakfast and vegetables during the first 3 days. I lived on a sugar rush for the first 3 days, and it really brought down my energy level.

- Accommodations and welcoming as well as hosting were very good and I felt really comfortable

I really liked the location of the place and the weather. All the staff was very kind. Our breaks were sometimes very long and undefined, a lot of hanging around basically, which I don't know if I liked. I really liked going to Rome. What was missing this week for me was playing outside, doing games, like big group games linked to the things we were learning.

 them or rest if needed free time in Rome was amazing it could have been longer because there
 were so many things to see, the food was also really good but I missed a bit more accessible
 fruit.

Beside that I really like the accommodation it was clean and appropriate (but we had only one pair of keys for room). Food was good I really liked that we had a change to try an Italian cuisine. Free time during week and also in the Rome was great. I just missed more specific schedule because it was changing constantly.

- Nothing










- Everything went better than expected

- Everyone added their experience, ideas and knowledge










- All of their experiences helped the group to perform well and to have different points of view about the different topics that web treated


















9. I know more about accreditation systems such as YouthPass.


I know more about accreditation systems as Youth Pass.




